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### **<Composition of the Festival>**

Programs shown at the festival are separated into two programs;

**Special Program:** Programs centered around trending themes from around the world.

**Competition:** Programs centered around a competition where one winner is chosen for each category.

The 3 official competitions will be for the 3 categories: “International”, “Japan” and “Asia International.”

The Grand Prix winner will be eligible for an Academy Award® nomination in the short film categories the following year.

2016’s Grand Prix winner, “Sing”, directed by Kristof Deak, won the Oscar at the 89th Academy Awards in the Short Film Live Action category, which marks the first time that an SSFF & ASIA-winning film has received an Academy Award®.

The best film for each category will be announced at the Award Ceremony, which will take place on June 11th, 2017. The Opening Ceremony will be held on June 1st, 2017.\* Invitation Only
